Opening welcome to Kahungunu whānau

Kōrero

Whānau invited to share their thoughts, worries and solutions regarding the current governments policy programme and its real or potential impact on iwi/Māori. Whānau advised that any motions tabled and agreed will be passed on to the Ngāti Kahungunu Iwi Incorporated (NKII) Board to inform their plan of actions to take to the hui call by the Kīngitanga scheduled for January 2024.

Summary of Motions

1. We as Kahungunu will not be dictated to by a political party. Kahungunu will be determining our own strategy in response to the Governments attacks on te iwi Māori. Moved by Te-O-Tāne Huata, seconded by Johnny Nepia Apatu – passed by all.
2. Calling on Ngāti Kahungunu to support the claim laid by Allan Brown with the Waitangi Tribunal. Moved by Allan Brown, seconded by Rob Whaitri, passed by all.
3. Ngāti Kahungunu support Māori wards, moved by Thompson Hokianga, seconded by Alayna Hokianga and passed by all.
4. Ngāti Kahungunu provide resource to provide Te Tiriti o Waitangi me Te Whakaputanga education/training. Moved by Tere Harrison and seconded by Mere Ruru, passed by all.
5. Ngāti Kahungunu take to government “if you want one people, one nation” then let that nation be Māori. Moved by Evelyn Ratima, seconded by Jerry Hapuku and passed by all.
6. Te Aka Charitable Trust is requesting Iwi get behind them to save 59 Marine Parade (Conservation house. Moved by Sarah Greening, seconded by Stephanie [Name], passed by all.

8. NKII calls a summit with all PSG's and Taiwhenua to stand shoulder to shoulder based on our intrinsic whakapapa.
9. Ngāti Kahungunu along with any other organisations, individuals or whānau to support the application being made by Huhana Lyndon and Marama Davidson to the health select committee for a smokefree Aotearoa. Moved by Sue Paku and seconded by Wi Huata, pass by all.
10. Kahungunu support the request that Waitangi and Tiakitai Marae be added to the Heretaunga/Tamatea Settlement Trust. Moved by Koro Te Whaiti and seconded by Ana Te Whaiti, passed by all.
11. Iwi to create and spearhead submission templates for whānau. Moved Zack Makoare, seconded by [Name] and passed by all.
12. NKII to issue a statement of no confidence in this government. Moved by Haora Hema, seconded by Mereana Pitman, passed by all.
13. That Ngāti Kahungunu never ceded sovereignty to the crown. Moved by Haora Hema, seconded by Mereana Pitman, passed by all.
14. Issue a statement that their position causes harm and will cause harm to mokopuna. Moved by Haora Hema, seconded by Mereana Pitman, passed by all.
15. Issue a statement that Te Tiriti should be formalised and entrenched in legislation so that the government cannot infringe and erode the whakapapa of our mokopuna and rights. Moved by Haora Hema, seconded by Mereana Pitman, passed by all.
16. Ngāti Kahungunu does not consent to the crown's assumption sovereignty over NK. Moved by Haora Hema, seconded by Mereana Pitman, passed by all.
17. Issue a statement that the policy to ban gang patches is discriminatory and overlooks social factors like poverty and abuse in state care and the governments' contributory role in gang growth. Moved by Haora Hema, seconded by Mereana Pitman, passed by all.

22. Ask all Kahungunu to wānanga to look at devolving resources to hapū and to report back on progress. Moved by Meka Whaitiri, seconded by Mereana Pitman, passed by all.

23. Ngāti Kahungunu support any hapū that want to return to their whenua – create a strategy and implement. Moved by Raihania Tipoki, seconded by Ihaia Rolo and passed by all.

24. Ngāti Kahungunu Iwi Incorporated actively object to any mining, marine and terrestrial. Moved by Raihania Tipoki, seconded by Meka Whaitiri, passed by all.

25. Make sure our people get good warm housing.

26. Establish a learning institution to support whānau into social and health professionals.

27. Implement along with our education plan to include education on the doctrine of discovery.

28. Each Iwi provides cultural safety for kaimahi working in government.

29. Establish a body that has eyes on policies, bills, and legislation.

Māori wards policy seeks to remove co-governance and reinstall referendums on Māori wards.

Ngāti Kahungunu support Māori wards, Ngāti Kahungunu support Māori wards, moved by Thompson Hokianga, seconded by Alayna Hokianga and passed by all.

4. Warena Wainohu

Ko te amorangi ki mua, iwi leaders, to stand strong and push Kahungunu kaupapa with the unreserved support by all of us who are Ngāti Kahungunu, te hāpai ō ki muri.

Don't leave this microphone empty.

Fiscal envelope deals - Waikato and Ngai Tahu, shut the doors on the rest of us.

Ngāti Kahungunu need to hold the line and be firm. Don't compromise us in front of Crown.

Let the rangatahi lead the resistance.

Be proud of yourselves you represent ancestors who fought for and gave up for our people.

Remind them that our people have given to this country, and they want to take more from us.

Noted only: Don't trust Waikato, don't trust Tainui – we want our own people to speak for us. Moved by Wi Huata, noted only.

8. Evelyn Ratima

We will fight.

We've seen the tides turn over the years. What have we learned?

Tātere read out email received from Jean.

MWWL along with Ngai Te Rangi are lodging a claim against the government for the proposed policy to remove s7AA from the Oranga Tamariki Act. Ngahiwi Tomoana and Jean Te Huia will be submitting a claim for the same reasons.

We must own the narrative – our narrative.

Karanga to all PSG's that it's our whakapapa that built the platform that you're on. Remember that when making corporate decisions.

Redesign and recreate our own tikanga.

Reminder Ngāti Kahungunu were the first iwi to introduce a smokefree strategy.

47000 signatories to smokefree repeal petition.

Huhana is lodging an application to the health select committee and Marama with the Māori selection committee and asking that anyone associated with Māori provider or health organization to put their names to the application.

We don't want our mokopuna to take up smoking.

Ngāti Kahungunu along with any other organisation, individual or whānau to support the application being made by Huhana Lyndon and Marama Davidson to the Health Select Committee for a smokefree Aotearoa. Moved by Sue Paku and seconded by Wi Huata, pass by all.

13. Koro Te Whaiti

Kahungunu support the request that Waitangi Marae and Tiakitai Marae be added to the Heretaunga/Tamatea Settlement Trust. Moved by Koro Te Whaiti and seconded by Ana Te Whaiti, passed by all.

People feel fearful of us because we walk our whenua, wave our flags etc. We need to unite as a people – kotahitanga. Let's be in support of each other.

Check ourselves first.

It's not about putea it's about kaupapa, if we take the putea out, let's see who turns up.

Rangatiratanga is not found in Wellington, rather it is in all of us. Give your children our values, education, pūrākau, Māori ways of being - that is where your rangatiratanga is.

There are two paths our motions sit in:

1. Rangatiratanga - We rely on ourselves, as Ngāti Kahungunu, and our tino rangatiratanga for those motions that we can empower.
2. Kāwanatanga - Partnership with the government for motions that rely on that partnership.

Mātāmua ko te rangatiratanga

Rangatiratanga should drive kāwanatanga.

We should create a rangatiratanga strategy that can be used by iwi chair when engaging with the government, whichever government - central or local.

Educating our people through a six-point strategy

1. Free resources on websites.
2. 6-week online courses on Te Tiriti and He Whakaputanga.

We need to start building our own systems and be prepared.

When we are self-reliant that's rangatiratanga.

Ngāti Kahungunu support any hapū that want to return to their whenua – create a strategy and implement. Moved by Raihania Tipoki, seconded by Ihaia Rolo and passed by all.

Would like to see a rest home for Māori that is conducive to who we are.

When the hospital moves, support the returning of the hospital land back to hapū. Shared concerns about the support whānau receive in the hospital and acknowledged that many whānau don't know where to go or what to tap into.

Would like NK to support a kaupapa ward at the hospital.

Ngāti Kahungunu Hui-A-Iwi

16 December 2023

Waimarama Marae

This loosely structured report is a summary of the feelings and opinions of whānau who did not stand to speak but shared their whakaaro with notetaker, Alicia. It is to be attached with the minutes of the Ngāti Kahungunu Hui-A-Iwi held on 16 december 2023, at Waimarama.

Two questions were asked of whānau:

1. Are you aware of the changes the new government has planned?
2. How do you feel about those changes?

Many whānau did not know about all the new proposals put forward by the coalition but shared their thoughts and feelings about what they did know. Their kōrero has been summarized below by theme.

Kotahitanga

The call for unity among all Māori is a priority where we tautoko each other and share expertise. Some whānau expressed that it would take every kaihoe to row our waka to emancipation for all Māori and for Ngāti Kahungunu. Others expressed that a call for unity has been ongoing for years and people are only just waking up to it now.

“We need to let go of the raru and aroha tētahi ki tētahi.” “We sing Tūtira Mai but we don’t live it.” “Our moko need to see us together.”

The need to stop being selective about who we let in to help us achieve what Ngāti Kahungunu needs was a strong talking point among some pakeke.

There was the notion that it was time the iwi leaders across Aotearoa came together to issue a statement of solidarity in the face of adversity by the government.

Mamae

An overwhelming majority of people who were asked how they felt regarding the changes proposed by the incoming government spoke of grief - one participant expressed how they felt they were being suffocated by the proposals.

“They hate us, they really hate us.” “It feels like we have targets on our backs.” “I am being forced to be disconnected..” “I’m angry, we must prepare to fight.”

A couple of participants commented that they felt like this undoing by the government was an attempt to degrade us on a national and international level, putting us back into the corner to die off.

Rangatiratanga

Some participants had ideas about how we can strengthen our pre-existing rangatiratanga:

- Learn te reo, make room for te reo Māori
- Workshops that help everyday people to tap into funding opportunities (Te Mātāwai) that uplift whānau rangatiratanga
- Educational resources about our haukaenga that can be used at home or in school to teach ourselves the pūrākau, the colonial history of te rohe o Kahungunu - so we know what we are fighting for.
- Whānau planning/hauora planning that is run through Taiwhenua/PSG

“I am rangatiratanga.” “The government doesn’t determine my future.”

Whānau are mostly comfortable and confident in their rangatiratanga and proud to be Ngāti Kahungunu.
